PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2018 is Milestone year for CBMCA

On November 29, 1978, Cliff Bungalow Community Association was incorporated under the Societies Act of Alberta. That means we are in our 40th year of operation and contributing to the community in many ways. One of the motivating factors in the formation of the community association was the process of creating the first version of the Cliff Bungalow Area Redevelopment Plan (since revised). In 1990, the boundaries were expanded from just the Cliff Bungalow Community District (as defined by the City of Calgary) to include Mission Community District (also as defined by the City of Calgary). During the review of the first version of the Cliff Bungalow Area Redevelopment Plan, we identified that from a planning perspective, we were already one community based on similar history, the location between the escarpment and the Elbow River, a common high street, similar historic built form and similar demographics. Thus we became the Cliff Bungalow – Mission Community Association. CBMCA provides a community voice on matters of importance to the community.

This is also the 30th year we have had a community centre in the former Cliff Bungalow School, a historic building in its own right. We took over part of this building as our community centre on September 1, 1988. Having a community centre has allowed us to do so much more than would have been possible if we did not have one. We have had a place to hold many meetings and events on an ongoing basis. It is a hub and helps to create a sense of community. In the early days, no one knew about the community. We are now recognized as a happening place.

Our History includes two other community associations

There have been two other community associations in the community. In 1951 the Mission District Community Association was formed. This was during the period after WWII when many of the older Calgary communities formally formed community associations. We do not know when this community association folded. The other community association was named Calgary Mission District Community Association. It was formed in 1980 in response to the creation of the first Mission Area Redevelopment Plan (since revised through a request of CBMCA). It folded in 1984 due to lack of interest.

Did you know?

Do you know the origins of our community? Two different land grants cover the area our community now occupies. The area east of 4th Street SW was part of a land grant to Father Lacombe in 1883. It was incorporated as Rouleauville on November 2, 1899 after two prominent citizens and brothers: Charles Rouleau, a member of the Supreme Court of the Northwest Territories and Dr Edouard Rouleau who helped establish the Holy Cross Hospital. In 1907, Rouleauville was annexed to Calgary and became known as Mission. Most streets were originally named after clerics and saints of the Catholic Church.

The area west of 4th Street SW was part of a land grant to the Canadian Pacific Railway. This area was progressively annexed by Calgary in 1906, 1910 and 1911 and became known as Cliff Bungalow. Many of the streets were originally named after governors-general.

Let There Be Light

At this dark time of year, it is more noticeable when streetlights are not working. This includes 4th Street, which has totally different types of light fixtures. If you notice a non-functioning streetlight, please phone 311 and let them know of the problem. You can also do this online and through your smart phone. Just report where the problem is.

In a social setting I spoke to a former 311 operator who told me people should report these situations as the City has so many street light fixtures, they do not always know which ones are not working. By reporting these occurrences, the problem will get addressed more quickly. It will also make it safer for those people walking at night. Icy patches are not always visible without functioning streetlights.



Volunteers Needed for Community Casino March 18 & 19, 2018

Volunteers are needed for the community casino being held on March 18 and 19, a Sunday and Monday. This is the community association's largest fundraising activity, and we are allocated this opportunity about every year and a half. The funds are used to pay for rent, utilities, cleaning and maintenance of our community centre plus other special projects such as the new community entrance signs.

We need to fill 38 volunteer shifts. If you can, please volunteer for both days, or two shifts. You do not require previous casino experience to volunteer. We have professional advisors and many of us have helped at many casinos over the years. There are three shifts a day, one starting late morning until around suppertime. This is followed by an evening shift to closing time. Then there is a late shift (starts around 11 pm) for people who count all the money from the gaming tables. We feed you and there are snacks and non-alcoholic beverages. When not busy, you can read, watch a video, do homework, talk about world or local affairs or do other things like that. We can pay for babysitting if you need it. We can also provide a ride to and from Cash Casino (Blackfoot Trail) where our event is located. Casinos in Calgary are smoke free, so you will not have to worry about smoke.

While you may not yet know if you're available on March 18 and 19, we need you to sign a volunteer form ASAP so we can submit your form and those of others along with our final submission to Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission two months prior to the casino. 

Capacity:

The hall has two areas, which can be used as one big hall or divided by a rolling partition. Both parts together can fit 104 people standing or 80 seated (sufficient chairs and tables for 80 are included in the rental).

Facilities:

Kitchen with stove, oven, fridge and microwave (dishes, utensils, coffeemaker, kettle, etc. not provided). There is also a wet bar with double fridge with glass doors. There is a big screen to use for presentations/films (projector not provided).

Restrictions:

Smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not permitted in the hall.

Rental fees:

\$200 for either 9 am to 4 pm (except during school days) or from 5 pm to 11 pm. The rate is reduced to \$120 per rental if renting 12 or more times per year. There is also a charity rate of \$75 per rental for charitable organizations with charitable number.

Have You Renewed Your Residential Parking Permit?

Most of Cliff Bungalow – Mission is part of Parking Zone J, in which qualifying dwellings can obtain parking permits that allow you to park on residential streets with 2-hour or permit-only parking restrictions. These expire at the end of February. If you had a permit in the last year, you will receive a letter in the mail.

Paper parking permits including visitor parking permits will no longer be issued. You can apply on-line at permits.calgaryparking.com. You will need to scan your vehicle licence (address inside the J parking area) to submit on-line or go into their office located at 620 - 9 Avenue SW (8:30 am to 4 pm). Phone number is 403-537-7000.

When you have visitors, you will have to register them online or phone if you do not have access to a computer or smart phone. You will also need to de-activate a visitor pass online or by phone. You can have a maximum of two visitors at one time. If you do not deactivate a visitor pass it will be automatically de-activated two weeks after activation.

Your parking permit will be valid for two years. Enforcement will be via photos of licence plates. You have likely seen the monitoring vehicles on commercial streets.

If there are more than two vehicles registered at an address, there is a \$50 + GST charge for each additional vehicle.

Supporting our Veterans: Pension for Life

Canadian Armed Forces members and Veterans want to know our government has their back if they become ill or injured as a result of their service.

In December, we announced our plan for a Pension for Life to provide better support for ill and injured Veterans. It includes:

- Tax-free financial compensation, with the choice of monthly payments for life, to recognize pain and suffering caused by a service-related disability.
- Income replacement for Veterans experiencing barriers returning to work, at 90% of their pre-release salary.
- Services and benefits to help Veterans with education, employment, and physical and mental health.

For example, a 25-year-old Veteran who is 100% disabled would see his/her monthly support increase from \$4,150 to \$5,890. For a 50-year-old who is 100% disabled, his/her monthly support would be almost \$9,000 (compared to \$7,270 in 2015).

Veterans' Education and Training benefit

In 2017 I was honoured to create the Veterans' Education and Training benefit. It will provide funding for tuition, books and living expenses to the tune of up to \$80,000. I also reopened the last of the nine Veterans Affairs Canada offices closed by the previous government and hired hundreds of staff to better support Veterans.

Added to this was the expansion of the pilot to open access to the Military Family Resource Centre, and unveiling a new Centre of Excellence in Veterans' care.

Unlike the previous Conservative government who closed offices and cut back service, we have already invested \$6 billion in supports and services for Veterans and their families. Now with Pension for Life, we are going a step further to provide financial security and help Veterans transition to a civilian life with meaning and purpose.
